With its sub-tropical microclimate, Penzance forms a giant hot house for exotic plants. Throughout history, landowners and garden designers have taken advantage of these conditions to create stunning displays of natural beauty which continue to this day.

MORRAB GARDENS

Originally created in 1841 these lovely public gardens are a haven of Mediterranean and sub-tropical plants. The gardens contain Morrab Library and feature some lovely Grade II architectural structures including a Victorian bandstand and fountain. Open all year.

TREMENHEERE SCULPTURE GARDENS

Tremenheere Sculpture Gardens: Opened in 2012, the woods, stream and dramatic vistas provide a perfect setting for large scale exotic and sub-tropical planting that showcase work from James Turrell RA, Kishio Suga, David Nash RA, Richard Long RA and Tim Shaw RA all of whom have visited and created site specific pieces to interact with the beautiful environment. Café and toilets on site. Open all year.

TRENGWAINTON GARDENS

Trengwainton Gardens: The National Trust run these beautiful gardens have extensive walled gardens and woodland walks leading to a terrace with seats and gazebos with a view over Mount's Bay. TREWIDDEN GARDEN

Trewidden Garden: Originally planted in the 19th Century, the 15-acre garden incorporates a magnificent collection of over 300 Camellias and Magnolias along with fantastic tree fern dells. Tearoom and shop on site. Open Spring to early Autumn.
